



STRANGE FEATURES ON OLD CARS Inspired by Ralph DeMichele

<u>The Rim Blow Steering Wheel</u>—There was no suspended horn ring or horn pad on the spokes, instead the inside of the rim could be depressed anywhere on its circumference to sound the horn. However, the hardening and shrinking of the rubber made it difficult to activate the horn. The lack of customer acceptance led to the discontinuation of the rim blow steering wheels after only a few years.

<u>Glovebox Mini-Bar</u>— The 1950's was a time when alcohol and cocktails were a priority over seatbelts. A



magnetic mini-bar was a favorite feather of the Cadillac Eldorado in 1957. Shot glasses had magnets holding them in place so they can remain stationary.

<u>Swivel Seats</u>—Chevy's rotating seat gave their customers the option to do a 180 degree swivel just in case they got bored on the long drive. The feature actually made getting in and out of the car easier.

Dog Sacks—The dog sack was attached to the car's running board and

to the door at its top. The dog could be placed inside and got fresh air through a head hole.

<u>Amphicar</u>—It is popularly believed that the Amphicar was a ridiculous car and an even more lousy boat. It was reasonably agile on land, and painfully slow in water, with a top speed of just 7 mph. Its single greatest shortcoming was the bilge pump's ability to keep up with leakage. If it could not, the Amphicar would became the world's most aerodynamic anchor. However, Amphicar enthusiasts have managed to keep the nearly 4,000 cars built between 1961 and 1968 still functional on the road and/or water.

<u>Illuminated Tires</u>— Goodyear launched these illuminated tires back in the 60's. The tires had a special formula of semi-translucent synthetic rubber and lit-up by bulbs mounted on the inside of the rims. The tires were to be available in a variety of colors too. Despite their cool straight out of tron-like-look, the idea was dropped.

<u>Lightning Rods Shifter</u>—In the 1980s, Oldsmobile was still producing their limited edition machines and for manual transmission fans, they introduced the coolest factory equipment shifter of all time, Hurst Lightning Rods. For an experienced driver this meant a lot of power. Since they were sold in limited numbers, it is rather difficult, but not impossible, to get your hands on them today.

<u>Three Wheels</u>—Reliant Robins manufactured by Reliant Motor Company in Tamworth, England, over the course of 30 years, isn't actually that reliant. Classified as a motorcycle, the driver only needed a motorcycle license making it affordable for the working class. However, a major drawback of the vehicle was its immediate tip over while making turns because of the three wheel model. Enthusiasts have come up with solutions such as a cement block on the passenger seat to counter balance or... just drive in a straight line!

HISTORY OF AUTOMOTIVE PAINT

When vehicles were first invented, modern auto paints were simply not available. Instead, people handpainted their cars using brushes and paint that they could purchase at their local stores. Because the paint faded and flaked away very quickly, many people would repaint their cars every year. Around 1900, automakers used the same varnishes that were used for carriages. Applying paint could take as long as 40 days for each vehicle, and after it dried, it had to be sanded and polished.

In the 1920s, Ford Motor Company started using paints made from nitrocellulose lacquers on automotive assembly lines. These paints had a substantially shorter drying time than the older varnishes. 1924 was a big year for both paint advancements and chrome plating. During that year, paint spray guns made their splash into the world of auto painting, making their appearance on assembly lines.

In the 1930s, automakers started using paints called stoving enamels. These paints provided glossier shines and much faster drying times. In the world of chrome, Dr. William Peacock developed a silvering spray in order to silver mirrors. At the time, mirrors were very expensive because they had to be individually made by master craftsmen. With the silvering spray in 1932, Dr. Peacock's discovery allowed thousands of mirrors to be manufactured every day, greatly decreasing the price of mirrors and making them widely available.

In 1955, General Motors started painting its cars with a new acrylic that required the cars to be baked after the acrylic was applied. This process gave the cars a consistent finish, but the finish wasn't as glossy as that provided by stoving enamels. In 1960, Ford Motor Co. began using acrylic stoving enamels, which provided the tough finish with more shine.

In the late 1980s, car manufacturers began using urethane and polyurethane paints on their vehicles. After the application, clear coats were then applied. This resulted in durable and highly glossy finishes.

The technology of automotive painting continues to evolve. Some car makers now use a process called electrocoating, which involves submerging vehicles in a primer bath and using electric currents to bind the coating to the metal. Spray chrome has also advanced significantly. People are now able to use PChrome chrome spray to achieve the same feel and look that is provided by chrome plating but at a fraction of the expense.
