# THE WOES OF E10 FUEL—Submitted by George Kavalak

We have all run into one problem or another with today's E10 gasoline since it became prevalent in the 1990's. There is usually no problem with fuel injected engines as the fuel is delivered under much higher pressures. But with carbureted engines be careful, whether it's your classic car or other small engine devices like lawn care equipment, etc..

Here is some information:

E10 gasoline is 10% ethanol and 90% petroleum gasoline. And who knows how accurately that gets mixed upon delivery at the local station!

Ethanol has a higher octane rating than gasoline. However it contains 34% less energy per unit volume than gasoline.

## Longevity issues:

Ethanol is hygroscopic (readily absorbs water). It absorbs water 50 times faster than conventional gasoline. If you don't drive your classic enough to keep refreshing your tank (and draining your wallet!) the ethanol in your tank keeps absorbing moisture and progresses to "phase separation".

During this phase separation, the ethanol rich fuel separates from the remaining fuel (making it ethanol deficient), leaving you with two fairly distinct fuels in the tank.

Over time, this creates two layers of fuel: The top will have fuel that has very low octane (ethanol deficient), and the fuel at the bottom (the ethanol rich water layer) that is extremely corrosive.

Symptoms of this can be poor performance from ethanol deficient fuel (lowered octane) or destruction of many aluminum, pot metal castings, rubber and plastic components due to the ethanol rich fuel.

E10 shelf life is about 100 days, or about three months. So, if you don't go thru your E10 quickly, take some storage precautions to keep it from absorbing moisture. Keep cans full and sealed; control temperature swings that cause condensation; and use fuel stabilizers to help delay phase separation.

## Vapor Locks:

If you are using E10 gasoline fast enough that storage problems are not an issue, you may still be running into other E10 issues. With your carbureted engine you may have experienced heat soak or vapor lock.

Vapor lock is related to the volatility of gasoline, the tendency to vaporize. You may have smelled fuel just after you shut off your hot engine. Fuel is evaporating or boiling out of your carb float bowls (percolation) as the engine temperature begins to climb due to lack of continued coolant flow and air flow.

Reid Vapor Pressure (RVP) is a measurement of volatility. It is the vapor pressure of the fuel at 100 degrees Fahrenheit.

Normal atmospheric pressure is about 14.7 psi. Any liquid with a vapor pressure greater than atmospheric pressure will boil. The higher the RVP rating, the greater the tendency of the fuel to vaporize (vapor lock).

# THE WOES OF E10 FUEL—Submitted by George Kavalak

There is a Winter Blend and a Summer Blend for our fuel. The Winter Blend has a higher RVP (~15.0) than the Summer Blend (~9.0); this lower boiling point or increased volatility in the Winter Blend helps with cold starting. The Summer Blend has a lower RVP as the warmer temperatures already assist in the vaporization process.

#### Remember:

**Winter:** High RVP = Lower Boiling Point = Faster Vaporization **Summer:** Low RVP = Higher Boiling Point = Slower Vaporization

Summer Blends are sold beginning the month of May.

The highest RVP gasoline commonly sold will have an RVP of around 15.0 psi. That fuel in your tank on a hot summer day would boil in the tank when the temperature hit 100 degrees. On a 70 degree day the heat in the engine compartment can reach well over 100 degrees, causing vaporization or fuel in the carb bowl or supply lines. (Not really an issue with fuel injected cars as the fuel is under pressure until injected.)

#### Solutions:

- · Cool the fuel and/or raise the boiling point.
- · Route fuel lines away from heat sources.
- · Insulate fuel lines in the engine compartment.
- · Insulate fuel lines near any exhaust pipes.
- · Keep fuel filter away from the top of engine.
- · Use a heat insulator between the intake manifold and carburetor.
- · Use a heat shield to reflect radiant heat from the engine (i.e. under Holley carb bowls).
- · Use an electric fuel pump (greater pressure, thus increasing boiling point, but it doesn't help the unpressurized fuel in the bowl).







# THE WOES OF E10 FUEL—Submitted by George Kavalak


#### **E10 Temperature Volatility:**

The following graph is provided just to illustrate how E10 fuel is much more sensitive to its temperature compared to non-ethanol gasoline. It plots the Vapor/Liquid Ratio (V/L) against the fuel Temperature (in degrees Centigrade and Fahrenheit).

To prevent vapor lock and environmental issues, automotive fuel specifications require that gasoline be tested to various standards. Some govern the assessment of vapor-liquid temperatures. In automotive fuel specifications, the temperature at which a ratio of 20 (vapor) to 1 (liquid) is reached (commonly referred to as  $T_{(V/L)} = 20$ ) indicates the risk of the fuel to form a vapor lock. This tendency is higher in hotter climates and higher altitudes.

The vapor pressure of an Ethanol blend is much lower than that of straight gasoline. The addition of ethanol changes the temperatures at which various V/L ratios occur. A critical V/L ratio, which can cause vapor lock, will be reached at much lower fuel temperatures with Ethanol blends than with straight gasoline.

Without getting into the standards details, just view the graph to see the comparison between E10 and straight gasoline. V/L ratios greater than 20/1 get into vapor lock.



You can see that E10 is much more sensitive to temperature increases than straight gasoline. E10 will reach a V/L of 20/1 about 10-12 degrees F lower than straight gasoline. And, it only takes an additional increase of 7—9 degrees F to get a very volatile V/L ratio of 50/1. Straight gasoline would reach this 50/1 ratio with an additional temperature increase of about 20 degrees F.

So, for your carbureted car, do all you can to eliminate the heat from your fuel—be it in the lines before your mechanical fuel pump, after your mechanical fuel pump in the engine compartment, and in the float bowls. Don't forget an insulator between your carb and the intake manifold.

A little insulation will go a long way. E10 volatility is very sensitive to temperature—at temperatures lower than straight gasoline and for smaller temperature increases than straight gasoline.

In April, 2017 (with Winter Blend...) we had an early heat wave and I experienced some vapor locking with the stop and go traffic. However, with Summer Blend fuel and upper 90 degree temps, along with use of the above recommendations, I have not had a reoccurrence of the vapor locking.





## DID YOU KNOW?

The 1964 Pontiac GTO is widely regarded as the first "muscle car." Pontiac owned the muscle scene in the early 1960s, but by 1968, that car had plenty of competition.

The Ford Mustang also made its debut in 1964. It was officially unveiled at the World's Fair in Flushing Meadows, New York. That same day, the car also debuted in showrooms across America, and close to 22,000 Mustangs were purchased.

The first Chevrolet Camaro to ever come off the production line was black. And originally, the Camaro was going to be called the Panther.

The 1969 Dodge Charger Daytona was banned by NASCAR. The car was named for the Daytona 500, and with its record-breaking speed, it won the first race it was entered in. Unfortunately, however, it was just too fast to last.

Pontiac's "The Judge" (a 1969 GTO) was named after a TV show skit. At the time, John DeLorean was the man in charge, and he chose to name the car after a show he watched and liked: "Rowan & Martin's Laugh-In."

"The Judge" was also featured in what's considered th<mark>e first-ever rock mu</mark>sic video. In the original TV commercial for this car, Paul Revere and the Raiders sang a <mark>so</mark>ng they wrote about it.

The original "Dukes of Hazzard" show featured a total of 309 Dodge Chargers – all 1969 editions. H<mark>ow can</mark> you tell a 1969 charger from a 1968? Look for the split grille on the front of the '69 model.

A 1977 Pontiac Trans Am starred in the movie "Smokey and the Bandit." F<mark>our</mark> were provided for the movie – all of which were badly damaged during production.

Chrysler's 426 HEMI engine was called "the elephant." It was extremely large and extremely powerful. In fact, at Daytona in 1964, the vehicles that placed first, second and third all had this engine – which is why NASCAR would eventually change its engine-related rules.
