Enough mushy stuff, let's talk cars.... My first car was a 1967 Camaro SS/RS 350 Camaro 350 4 speed 3:73 posi with deluxe interior and loaded to the hilt for speed. Unfortunately, in August of 1971 I hit a telephone pole on the way home from a party. I totaled it and the police estimated I was traveling over 100 mph when I left the road. The only thing I remember is crossing the end of the road airborne. Until I saw 2 familiar faces, guess who, Pat Brent and my sister Jane. They found me after the crash.

I went against my upbringing and bought a 1963 Plymouth Belvedere F/X (Factory experimental). That was first of many Mopar's such as Road Runners and Ford Mustangs and a few 427 63 ½ Galaxies and other non-GM cars I have owned. At one point from 1968 to 1975 I had anywhere from 10 to 15 cars at once in different conditions. I have owned at least one make or model for each year from 1946 to 1987. When I was laid off from driving for IBM in 1992, I decided to open my own restoration business for 1955 to 1972 cars and trucks and specializing in 55 to 57 Chevys and 64 to 72 A bodies and 67 to 72 Camaros. I also sold 55 to 72 Chevy parts. That closed in 2001 when my partner decided that he wanted all the money and product and took everything and left me with the bills and unfinished projects. He sold everything while I was on vacation and he took off out of the country. That's when I went back to driving at Scholastic.



One last thing if you noticed in my confirmation picture you should note the vehicle behind me. I guess that was the beginning of my love for 57 Chevys. That was the only car I ever rode in with my grandfather.

## Classic Car Trivia—The Early Ford Thunderbird's



The Ford Thunderbird began life in February 1953 in direct response to Chevrolet's new sports car, the Corvette, which was publicly unveiled in prototype form just a month before. Under rapid development, the Thunderbird went from idea to prototype in about a year, being unveiled to the public at the Detroit Auto Show on February 20, 1954. Like the Corvette, the Thunderbird had a two-seat coupe/convertible layout. Production of the Thunderbird began later on in 1954 on September 9 with the car beginning sales as a 1955 model on October 22, 1954.

Ford was not in favor of a "sports car", the new car was designed as a "personal" car. Interesting, the names initially considered such as Beaver, Hep Cat and Wheelaway were all rejected in favor of the Thunderbird, a revered symbol of the Pacific Northwest native culture and one always seen at the top of the totem pole.





The Littlebird was the first model off the line 20 months after getting the green light to build it by Ford. It was a two-seater with a choice of convertible or hardtop powered by a 292 cid V8 (the Corvette at this time only had a 6 cylinder). The new T-Bird used a good number of regular Ford parts to hold costs down. They included headlights, taillights and instruments. The parts sharing also let Ford successfully use the 2,980-pound Thunderbird to rub off some of its sporty, glamorous image on the restyled regular Fords.

Although the 1955–57 Thunderbird was a success, Ford executives were concerned that the car's position as a two-seater limited its sales potential. As a result, the car was redesigned as a four-seater for 1958. For 1959, the car received a new grille and a newly optional, 350 horsepower, 430 cu in V8.

For 1960, the Thunderbird was given another new grille and other minor stylistic changes along with a newly optional manually operated sunroof for hardtop models. The Thunderbird was redesigned for 1961 with sleeker styling that gave the car a distinctively bullet-like appearance. The car was Indianapolis 500 pace car in 1961 and was featured prominently in US President John F. Kennedy's inaugural parade.

Introduced in 1962 was the Landau model, with a vinyl roof and simulated S-bars on the rear pillars. This was the beginning of the 1960s/1970s fashion for vinyl roof treatments, and a vinyl roof was a popular Thunderbird feature for the next twenty years.


