ORIGIN OF THE BOWTIE—Submitted by Chris Peedin

Legend has it, that Billy Durant came up with it's famous bowtie logo when he saw a design on wallpaper in a Paris hotel, but it turns out, that isn't true.

The real story found in the 50th Anniversary Issue of "The Chevrolet Story" published in 1961 tells the real story.

According to Billy Durant's wife, in an interview by Lawrence R. Gustin, who interviewed her for his book "Billy Durant," in 1973 — the bowtie emblem was first seen by her husband in an illustrated Virginia newspaper, while they vacationed in Hot Springs, Virginia around 1912.

Mrs. Durant said: "We were in a suite reading the papers, and he saw this design and said, 'I think this would be a very good emblem for the Chevrolet"

Notice some of the similarities between the Coalettes and Durant designed Chevrolet Bowtie! Both started with a 'C', had nine letters, had the suffix 'let', and were hard to pronounce-in a French way. Both emblems had a dark background with white boarders and white letters. The main difference was the Coalettes letters were slanted and used a stylistic type face, while Durant used a more formal Roman type face and squared off the center bow, three letters wide.



It looks like the reason the Southern Compressed Coal Co. designed the bowtie logo in the first place was to highlight the large, middle 'E', to help the public pro-nounce this coined word easier. Maybe, this is where Durant got the idea, "Pronounced Shev-Ro-Lay."

DID THEY REALLY ????

The Pangra

The Pangra was based on the Ford Pinto, a car which came about as a result of the 1970s oil crisis and the subsequent move

away from big American muscle cars. Pangra was the brainchild of Jack Stratton, general sales manager at Huntington Ford in Arcadia, California; the goal was to keep the performance torch burning in whatever way he could. The vision was to make a domestic 2+2 sports coupe to rival the likes of the Datsun 240Z and Porsche 914.

The stock Ford Pinto of the time made as low as 54hp depending on engine choice but the Pangra received a turbocharged 2.0L SOHC



engine that put out almost four times the power. It reached 60mph in 7.5 seconds. All Pangras were based on the 2-door sedan body style of the Pinto, although there was a one-off Pangra based on the 2-door station wagon.

The Pangra could either be had as one of 4 different kits or it could be bought as a complete car from Huntington Ford with all of the equipment already installed.

Kit 1 included the distinctive fiberglass front end with a revised hood, grill, fenders and hidden headlights operated by a lever in the interior.

Kit 2 included all of kit 1 plus Recaro high-back bucket seats, Stewart
-Warner gauges, custom console and dashboard trim, machined

"Mag-Shot" wheels and bigger tires measuring 175HR13s in the front and 185HR13s at the rear.

Kit 3 included everything from the first two kits as well as a Spearco "Can Am" kit which featured shortened front coil springs, heavy duty front and rear sway bars and a full set of KONI shock absorbers.



Kit 4 is the most remembered of the 4 and featured all 3 previous kits and featured a Spearco turbocharger kit bolted to the original 2.0 liter SOHC 4 cylinder, as well 7:1 compression, water injection and an O-ringed head.
