Hilltop Home—By Les Shelton

On July 30th, David Smith and a group of PCCC Members presented a check for \$6,500 to Diane VanHusen. This check was the proceeds from the 2019 PCCC 'Made in the U.S.A. Carshow.' To date, PCCC has donated \$63,000 to Hilltop Home. Diane told the members on hand how much they appreciated our donations as some of their sources of funding were no longer available.

Hilltop Home cares for 22 children who have major medical issues and severe/profound developmental disabilities that require specialized 24-hour care. The children who live there range in age from one year through eighteen years of age. We took a tour of the facility, and saw the class rooms and main room. At Hilltop Home, the children are offered the opportunity for education, play, and they also have interaction with the community.

One of the classroom teachers showed us how they use an interactive white board that the club had helped to pay for. We also saw the outdoor space that PCCC donations had helped pay for a sunbrella sun screen and some wheelchair height planters. We also saw some of the children's bedrooms. Most all of the children need special needs and our club donations have helped also pay for some of those special beds for the children. It was easy to see that they treat each child with love and respect. I would encourage all members who have any questions about if our funds are going to the right place, to take a tour of Hilltop Home.

Classic Car Trivia—The Early Years Of BUICK



Before becoming a trademark of automobile luxury and innovative engineering, Buick was rather fond of plumbing inventions. Born in Arbroath, Scotland, David Dunbar Buick experienced a second-coming to life in his mid 30's when he became particularly interested


in gasoline engines. He soon discarded his plumbing-related activities and, by the 1900's, he had already built an impressive number of engines for farming and boating usage. Buick's passion for motors led him to establishing his own company, called Auto-Vim and Power Co.

Buick is one of the oldest automobile brands in the world and the oldest in the United States. The first two Buick automobiles were made in 1899 and 1900. In 1904 Buick, whose company was now called "Buick Motor Company", moved to Flint, Michigan. David Buick incorporated his company as the Buick Motor Company on May 19, 1903, in Detroit, Michigan. The first Buick made for sale, the 1904 Model B, was built in Flint, Michigan at a

re-purposed factory that was known as the Flint Wagon Works. There were 37 Buicks made that year, none of which survive.

The first full-size Buick to join the smaller Model B was in 1907, when the Model D was introduced with a four-cylinder 255.0 cu in (4,178 cc) T-head engine, installed in the front with rear wheel drive. This was one of the only cars with side valves that Buick ever made.





In 1911, Buick introduced its first closed-body car, four years ahead of Ford, but five years after Cadillac, which was the first. The car was built at the all -new factory in Flint which later became to be known as Buick City. Buick during the 1920s made various sized vehicles, with series designations for different years, sometimes using numbers, while later years using lettered designations. One of the larger vehicles, with straight-six, was the Buick Master Six.

In 1908, Buick claimed U.S. car leadership with production of 8,820 vehicles. Buick has a deep motorsports history, proving its performance on race tracks as early as 1908. A Buick has served as Official Pace Car of the Indianapolis 500 six times, and the brand also won two NASCAR Manufacturer Championships, in 1981 and 1982.

In the 1910s and 1920s, Buick was a prestige brand in the Republic of China with brand driven by or for high level politicians and the Emperor. Buick now sells 80% of its production in the People's Republic of China and is a minor player in the Republic of China on Taiwan.

In 1929, as part of General Motors' companion make program, Buick Motor Division launched the Marquette sister brand, designed to bridge the price gap between Buick and Oldsmobile; however, Marquette was discontinued in 1930. All Buick, Marquette, Viking, and Oldsmobile products shared the newly introduced GM B platform starting in 1926. Buick debuted two major achievements for the 1931 model year, the OHV Buick Straight-8 engine and a synchromesh transmission in all models but the Series 50.

A traditional Buick styling cue dating to 1949 is a series of three or four vents on the front fender behind the front wheels. The VentiPorts helped ventilate the engine compartment to minimize the engine overheating. The suggestion was made that they allowed air flow out of the engine bay. Air entered from the grill into the engine bay and was pressurized by the radiator fan, and exited through the VentiPorts.
