

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### Anniversary Surprise By Steve Larue

Our 57<sup>th</sup> Anniversary to Florida trip was marked by grace, yes this is a God story. It is also a technical story, a challenge that when we embarked on our trip, we could not have anticipated. For those who want to hear about the technical quickly, check Google "C5 Corvette Harmonic Balance Issue."

Jane and I bought a very nice looking, low mileage (less than 27K) 1999 Corvette for this year's trip to Florida (and future trips). It has plenty of storage for golf clubs and all our luggage. 3 days before our departure, I heard what I thought were squeaky belts (Air & Serpentine). I sought to get them changed, and was successful at getting the work done. During the process of putting on the new serpentine belt, the first one had tiny groves and spun off the tensioner when the engine was revved. A newer serpentine belt with deeper groves was procured and solved that problem.

Ok READY! or so I thought. We made the 600-mile trip over 2 days, stopping in Savannah for an overnight break. As we were arriving at our condo unit the next day, Jane heard a little noise. I explained I thought it was the new serpentine belt wearing in. We parked, unloaded the car, then I went outside under the hood to check it out. Two grooves of the serpentine belt were off the harmonic balancer, and 2 grooves off the tensioner. I got out a few tools I had, then suddenly two condo attendants were asking if I needed help. Together were put the tensioner belt back on. When I started the car, the same two grooves spun off.

I asked where the closest good repair shop was, and they responded Pep Boys up the road 3 miles, in Celebration Station. It was already late at night, so I called them for an appointment the next day. We took the car in and they arranged transportation for us to an Avis Rent a Car that we had contacted the night before.

Nervously the Corvette was left multiple nights as the issue was being researched and diagnosed. The entire time while I was worrying, Jane was saying have faith. God got us to Florida without a breakdown, and it will get fixed. When I went in to talk to the attendant, he introduced himself. His name was pronounced "Hey-SOOS", which is spelled Jesus in Spanish. Hmmm, interesting? He said, "we'll find the problem and fix it." Anyway, I was thinking a new tensioner was needed. They called and I got the good news/bad news story. Tensioner was fine, but the harmonic balancer needed to be replaced and it would cost \$1309 to fix. Ouch!!!!!!

Obviously, I said do the work, which they did, and we in the end made a peaceful drive home. The rental car served us well, and we did do everything we were wanting to do. One item was our 50yr anniversary visit to Magic Kingdom. We were there with our first 3 young girls in November 1971. Disney World opened in October 1971, and we were there 6 weeks later. Oh, what memories, they came flooding back with a tear in the eye.

God story: To this moment I cannot tell you how we made it to Florida without someone watching over us. The serpentine belt spinning off where we had the belts change in NC, that was a symptom. The squeak in Florida was the Harmonic Balance that had just started to rub on the Timing Chain cover. The damage that could have been done was significant ............................... BUT we were OK. THANK HEAVEN!!!

I've enclosed 2 pictures of my Harmonic Balancer. The separated parts on front side view should be flush with each other. Backside view shows some shine on the edge where it had started to rub against the timing chain cover. Mine is off by about 3/8 of an inch, the outer part moving toward the engine. For you C5 & C6 Vette Owners, check your Harmonic Balance for this not-so common issue. It might also apply to any LS1 engine in other models.







# Classic Car Trivia The Plymouth Duster



The Valiant was a compact car. To give it a sportier look and feel, \$15million was spent on making a semi-fastback two-door coupe that became the Plymouth Duster. The 1970 model years came with a Valiant badging, but post that the Duster was simply a standalone car. The Duster also shared its A-body platform with the Dodge Dart and the first two generations of the Barracuda.

Pitted against the likes of the slightly smaller Ford Maverick and the AMC Hornet, the Duster also managed to complete well with the slightly larger Chevrolet Nova. Of course, while the Maverick and the Nova also came in four-door versions, the Plymouth Duster was a two-door coupe for all of its short if impactful life. The Duster was also marketed as an alternative to the original Volkswagen Beetle, as well as the new class of domestic subcompact cars such as the Chevrolet Vega.

As the '70s went on, gasoline prices soared and engine outputs plummeted. Even so, the Duster continued to offer V-8 power and muscle car decor such as hood scoops, stripes, and wild colors with names like "sassy grass" and "lemon twist." Famous drag racers Tom "The Mongoose" McEwen and Mopar's Sox & Martin duo campaigned Dusters to enhance the model's image. One engine that separated the Duster from the Valiant was the availability of the vaunted 5.5L 340 cid V8, better known as the "Duster 340". Duster 340s got their own dashboards with round gauges and 150 MPH speedos - basically the exact dash that was previously in the 1967-1969 A-body Barracuda.



In 1971, The Duster dropped its "Valiant" designation this year, being known simply as "Duster". Dusters received a new grille this year, but all else remained the same. Dodge now had a version of the Duster called the Demon, which was based (naturally) on the Dart. The 'Twister' was also introduced in '71. Dodge had a version of the Duster called the Demon, which was based (naturally) on the Dart. The Demon 340 effectively replaced the Dart Swinger 340.

In 1972, Dusters received new taillights, they were longer than 70 and 71 taillights. The "Twister" package was still available, from 71. All engines were rated at net horsepower this year, resulting on horsepower decreases across the board for all engines.

Dusters received their first (and only) minor restyling in 1973, with an all new nose and new tail treatment. Dusters could have a fold-down "convertible" rear seat, greatly enhancing cargo space. Dusters with this option were subsequently known as "Space Duster's".

In 1974, the Duster got a new larger rear bumper but all else the body stayed the same as 73. The 340 was no longer available, being replaced with a 360 cid V8 (also spelling the end of the "Twister" model). The 360 wasn't nearly as popular as the Duster 340,

In 1975, Dusters received a new grille mirroring the Valiant's. Some Dusters started requiring unleaded gas this year, depending on where in the U.S. it was sold.

In 1976, The Duster was visually unchanged for its final year, but it nonetheless had some other various changes, not the least of which being the slow-selling 360 V8 was no longer available - the 318 V8 was now the top engine option. A new "Silver Duster" appearance package was available, which was (naturally) silver in color. Another interesting new package was the "Feather Duster", which was available only as a Slant Six, and employed various weight-saving techniques such as aluminum inner hood and trunk bracings and bumper brackets.
