I grew up in Cary, NC and had a fun childhood there. My parents divorced when I was young. I'm mostly closer to my moms side of the family. We had to wipe the bottom of our shoes before we got in.

When I was in Junior high school several of my friends older siblings and neighbors had muscle cars and I loved the look and sound. They would hangout at the mall and bowling alley parking lots. I met a guy named Mike that asked me out that had a 72 Vega and a 69 Camaro when I was close to turning 16. While out cruising with him we ran across a 75 Camaro for sale for \$900. I had baby sitting money saved up and had just recently had a birthday and money is what I asked for. I had just enough to buy it and maybe and some spare for gas. The man selling it owned a body shop and he copied the paint job out of a Hot Rod magazine. It had a rainbow paint job and stood out like sore thumb. Mike's grandfather owned a shop and he went over the car for me and fixed a few things and helped me get new tires for the rear since it had drag slicks on it.

At the age of 18 I moved to Garner and bought a red 67 Camaro for \$1200 and eventually sold the 75. Couldn't afford to keep both and got a few tickets that cost me from both of them. Classic Car Trivia—Chevrolet Engines

265CI V8: New for model year 1955, it powered over one-half of all new Chevys sold, the same in 1956. Production run ended in mid 1957.

283CI V8: Option from model year 1957 through 1967, also used work trucks.

L65 327 V8: From 1958 through 1964, engineers bored and stroked the 283 to 327ci's.

348 & 409 "W" ENGINES: The 348 was originally designed to be a heavy-duty truck engine. The 1961-'65 high-performance 409 was a bored and stroked 348.

L78 396CI V8: First used at Daytona in 1963. Designed to make Chevrolets competitive on the NASCAR high banks. In February 1965, two Turbo Jet 396 "big-block" engines replaced the pair of 409s: RPO L35, a 325hp torque engine featuring high-velocity, oval-port heads and an 800-cfm Rochester Quadrajet carb; and RPO L78.

L72 427CI: Offered in 1966 Corvettes and 1966, 1968, and 1969 full size passenger cars. Rated the same as the 1965 L78 396.

L88 427CI: The 1967-'69 RPO L88 race engine, only available from the factory in the Corvette.

427CI ZL1: Developed initially for the 1969 Camaro Super Stock competition, it was only available through "Central Office Production Order 9560 (COPO)

LS6 454CI: A one-year/one-model super engine (1970 Chevelle SS).

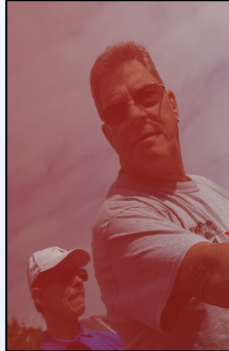

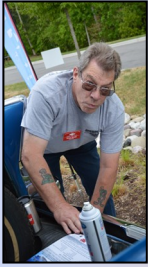
