If you may find this to be an interesting feature, send me a photo of yourself when you were younger and along with a current photo of yourself. Send your story after to be published the following month.


The newsletter that will follow will then reveal who you are and your story posted. Look for this feature during the course of the year.

Classic Car Trivia— The 1st Oldsmobile F-85's



The Oldsmobile F-85 was introduced in 1961 as a "Senior" compact, entry level vehicle (GM Y-Body). The car was known for being the base model which the Cutlass name was created. Olds had earlier used the Cutlass name on a 1954 Motorama show car. Oldsmobile designer Irvin Rybicki began work on the Olds model in 1957. It finally went on sale in 1960 as a 1961 model.

The F-85 was considered to be related to the Buick Special and Pontiac Tempest. The F-85 was Oldsmobile's smallest vehicle by a wide margin – some two feet shorter than the next-smallest model they had on offer, and was also their most affordable. The F-85 Cutlass trim added some sportiness, along with more upscale interior and exterior appointments. The Olds F-85 Jetfire was the first turbocharged car.

The F-85 had double wishbone front suspension and a four-link live axle in the rear, suspended with coil springs all around. Standard engine was the new Rockette 215 cu in (3.5 l) all aluminum V8, (which later became famous as the Rover V8).

Transmission options were initially a three-speed manual and the newly introduced three-speed Roto Hydramatic.

The Oldsmobile F-85 Jetfire generally looked like a Cutlass coupe, but it did have the distinction of being the only true hardtop in the F-85 line; all other closed two-doors had fixed door frames and B-pillars.
