





Tech Corner—By, David Smith

HINT—Anyone who has ever tried putting gear oil in a rear end or manual transmission might like this idea.

I took a cheap siphon pump with the rubber ball type of pump. Removed the hose from one end. Cut the end of the bottle cap to fit the end of the bulb extension. Cut the other hose approximately 6 inches. Insert hose into the opening of the rear or trans and turn the bottle upside down. I also squeezed out a few ounces then made a small hole in the bottom of the bottle (that would be the top of the upside down)







Tech Corner—Car Photography By, Jeff Hopp

To start, you surely want to grab the attention of whoever might be viewing your photos, whether you're showing it off or posting a photo when selling your car.

Your car should be freshly washed and waxed, and its interior should be freshly vacuumed and free of debris. Clean out the ashtrays (Ha,Ha), tidy up the trunk, and clean the engine bay.

Make your car stand out by finding an open spot, preferably away from the shade of buildings, and other large objects. However a photo with an old barn or other interesting structure is cool. A photo surrounded by beautiful of colorful landscapes is always appealing. Large open lots with gravel or unmarked pavement are ideal. Good backgrounds make good car photos.





Try to photograph your car near mid-day on an overcast day. Cloudy days are best because the entire sky acts as a soft filter for sunlight that illuminates your car evenly and eliminates harsh shadows. Also, just after sunrise or sunset are good times of the day for getting some good shots. If you know how, converting your photo to black and white is surely different as well. Smartphones have some good editing features. There are also simple photography software that are easy to use for simple editing, enhancing or cropping. I use Adobe Photoshop Elements.

If using a DSLR, consider using a polarizing filter for shots of your vehicle's exterior. Polarizing filters can help suppress glare on the windows.

Different angles, either from at some height or eye level or even from below (if your knees can handle that), can make your photo unique.

Lights on is a nice artistic touch. If you're shooting a convertible in particular, all windows up, or all down makes for a better shot than some up and some down. Remember to straighten the steering wheel if you're doing an interior shot.



Either smartphones or digital cameras are great for car photography. Smartphones have powerful enough lenses to capture the photos you might be looking for. I personally use both.

Go out there and have some fun.







Some Chevelle Stuff

The Chevelle was introduced in 1964 as Chevrolet's response to the success of smaller cars, particularly the Ford Fairlane. It was designed to fit between the smaller Chevrolet II and the brand's full-sized vehicles. It debuted with a starting price of just over \$2,000.



Chevrolet produced over 1.2 million Chevelles in the first year alone. Over its entire production run, Chevrolet made more than 5 million Chevelles.

The Chevelle was available in various body styles, including twodoor and four-door sedans, convertibles, station wagons, and coupes, from the standard 300 series to the high-performance SS models.



The first-generation models (1964 to 1967) were designed with a distinct A-body platform.

The second generation (1968 to 1972) saw the implementation of a more streamlined, aerodynamic design and the introduction of the luxurious Malibu model.





The third and final generation (1973 to 1977) featured a comprehensive redesign to comply with new safety regulations. The Chevelle lineup was also streamlined, shifting focus toward the Malibu.

By 1978, the Chevelle nameplate was discontinued and fully replaced by the Malibu.



The LS6 engine option for the Chevelle, available in 1970, is the highest factory-rated horsepower engine offered to the general public in a production car during the muscle car era.



Don Yenko, a Pennsylvania Chevrolet dealer known for his custom muscle cars, ordered a unique fleet of Chevelles with an L72 427-cubic-inch V8 engine in 1969. These special-order cars, known as Yenko Super Cars.

Chevelle SS models dominated the drag racing and street racing scenes in the late '60s and early '70s, and the model won two NASCAR Grand National Championships in 1971 and 1972.
